General Practice Network NT (GPNNT) is the peak body representing the Territory's non-government General Practice and Primary Health Care sector. GPNNT provides professional support to GPs, practices and health services through a number of programs, one of which is the NT GP Locum Program. The Locum Program is seen as one of the single most important services in place to support incumbent GPs in rural and remote areas across the Northern Territory. It is primarily run to support resident GP positions but it also assists clinics that do not have a resident GP.

Interested in sampling life in the Territory? There are always opportunities for Locum General Practitioners to work in a variety of locations in the Northern Territory, from the main towns and regional centres, to more isolated remote Aboriginal communities in the deserts of Central Australia and the tropical Top End. Locum GP positions are available in mainstream General Practice or in Aboriginal Health, or a combination of both.

Practicing medicine in the Northern Territory is varied, interesting and challenging, requiring adaptive and innovative work practices, and a multidisciplinary team approach. The rewards of such work are great, and there are opportunities to really make a difference. The length of contract is negotiable.

Locum Program conditions:

- The locum is sub-contracted to provide GP Locum Services in agreed locations throughout the Northern Territory
- Payment of \$5,000 /week (based on a 5 day working week, with minimal on-call) or \$1000/day plus GST.
- All travel and accommodation are provided at no cost to the locum, with in Australia.
- Copies of the CARPA Standard Treatment Manual (STM), Women's Business Manual and Tropical Health Manuals provided and Binan Goonj – Bridging Culture in Aboriginal Health
- GPNNT Locum coordinator will organise all travel, land permits, and provider numbers.

The support a locum can expect:

- Locums are supported by fellow Drs within a group practice, by experienced remote area nurses and Aboriginal health workers, and by the Remote Medical Practitioner (RMP) if in a remote location.
- Locums will only be placed in safe, adequately staffed clinics.
- Locums have telephone support from GPNNT Clinical Services Advisor and the DMO/RMP on call.

Locum eligibility requirements:

- Eligible for unconditional registration as a GP in Australia.
- Obtain a current National Criminal History Check
- Hold VR status or be a fellow of RACGP or ARRCM
- Have your own ABN or be able to apply
- Provide evidence of current Medical Indemnity Insurance
- Provide GPNNT with Certified copies of your :
 - Current Medical Board Registration
 - Photo ID (passport or drivers license)
- Be available for a minimum of 2 – 4 weeks
